More than 250 people enjoyed a great night of catching up with old friends, a wonderful three course meal and drinks and were entertained by the school choir Con Anima and the barbershop quartet. Guest speaker, scientist Shaun Hendy, talked about the exciting potential

of technology and the jobs and opportunities that will be provided.

The fourth annual dinner raised \$38,000 to equip the college's new science labs once the block has been upgraded and strengthened.

The highlight of the auction of donated prizes was the tense bidding for an All Blacks history book with hundreds of autographs of players who have worn the black jersey, many of them deceased. The book was donated by old boy Tim Reynolds and was sold for \$8,000.00.

Thanks to Tim and all the many others who contributed to a memorable night through donations, sponsorship or attendance at an enjoyable night. The college is grateful for the incredible support of so many dedicated people.

so many of the values and traditions they had experienced were still most evident amongst the pupils and staff they met.



#### THE OLD COLLEGE FROM BEHIND ...

This rather unusual view of the old college recently came into the archives.

The photograph was taken, probably from the top of the Carillon, sometime in the early 1930's – the Carillon being completed in 1932. The barren slopes of Mt Victoria are clearly visible. A depression work scheme led to the whole hillside being planted with trees towards the end of the 1930s.

The college building itself can be seen with the high chimneys, which were taken down after the 1942 earthquake. The building at the extreme left, was in two parts. One was wooden and was demolished in 1959 at the time the science block was constructed. The other part was concrete, and remained until the whole college was demolished, at the time of transfer to Kilbirnie, in 1979.

The area to the right of the main building was, until about 1945, occupied by St Joseph's Parish Church (the octagonal building lower right) and primary school. The parish school's main classroom block (with the cross on top) can be seen at the lower right. The parish moved to its present site on the other side of the Basin Reserve in about 1950, and the college absorbed the land and buildings of the former primary school. The main classroom retained its title and was known to boys of the 50s, 60s and 70s as the St Joseph block.
